Director's Note

In the lead up to touring our first musical, *Girl Inside*, in 2020, I was nervous about the format that we had created. A series of serendipitous events brought me to write a brand-new story and develop a fully-fledged production that had been pre-booked for a week of school shows. I was so sure that what we were putting together was something special – that was until the time came for our first performance.

There is no audience member more honest than a child, a fact I was acutely aware of as I sat behind the sound desk while our debut production played out to a whole crowd of them. Were the themes too complex? Was it interesting enough? Was it worth all the effort? The hour-long show came to an end, the kids filed out class by class, and we began packing up to move on to our next school. Even after our first performance I was still filled with doubt that what we had delivered was not up to scratch, until a teacher came up to me and handed me a sticky note with a quote from one of her students that read:

"It's showing everyone that you've always got one person in your life to give you confidence."

When morning comes and the storm clouds are replaced with a yellow sunrise, Linus is reminded why he chose to become a scientist all those years ago.

Simon Blacket holds a Bachelor of Science (Honours) degree, with Majors in Chemistry and Mathematics, for which he was awarded the Honours Alumni University Medal. In 2019, he started Silly Science with Simon with the goal of making science fun and exciting for kids. His YouTube videos have over 500,000 views, and his live shows have been performed to captive audiences at the Capri Theatre.

TIMES 10am & 2pm Every year on Christmas Eve, 11-year-old Jack Barker and his grandpa delivered candy canes and other sweets to the houses in their town, but this Christmas will be the first since Grandpa passed away. As the Barker's move into the newly inherited family home – the traditional gathering place for Christmas – Jack refuses to join the celebrations, believing that doing so would be leaving his grandpa behind.

However, one night after an argument with his parents Jack finds himself in the village of Grunkles – the miniature makers of Christmas sweets - who have made their homes within the forgotten encyclopedias and history books that sit on the top shelves of his grandpa's bookcase. The Grunkles had found refuge with Jack's grandpa after escaping a great reckoning in their homeland. But now Grandpa is no longer around, they have no way of getting all the Christmas sweets out to the children of the town. Although reluctant at first, Jack grows close to the amiable creatures and carries on the tradition of delivering the Grunkles' sweets to every house in town. All the while Jack learns how to cope with his loss, he rediscovers his joy for Christmas, and reconnects with his family.



What makes our shows special?

Our stories are written to not only impact the minds of kids but touch their hearts, leaving them with precious memories that will last beyond the 60-minute runtime. They are special because each one is a completely original local product, from head to toe. We use sweeping orchestral backing tracks to build atmosphere and give students a sense of the cinematic, while giving them moments to laugh, connect and reflect.

At the centre of each musical is a young child, usually around 12 years old.

This is so students can more readily engage with the character's journey and see themselves in their shoes. This is helped by the mix of adult and youth performers, allowing students to look up to kids who are closer to their age.





The Company

The Flying Elephant Company began touring original musicals to schools in 2020, with *Girl Inside*. Before this however, the company went under a different name, Spark of Inspiration, and toured juke-box musicals to SA primary schools. Over the years, the company has performed shows to over 30,000 students, and the shift towards new and original work by South Australian artist Benji Riggs brings an exciting new chapter for the company.



Our mission is to create character driven stories that explore rich and complex themes, that teaches kids to dream fearlessly, that there is wonder to be found in the most unlikely of places.

We want to empower relationships within families and friendships, showing that there is good to be found in a strong community where personal growth and connection is prioritised.

While The Flying Elephant Company is venturing out into public seasons, including the world premiere of *The Boy with the Golden Fox* in 2022 and its second sold out season in 2023, we're proud to continue offering a diverse range of original theatre to South Australian schools.

Pricing

Tickets are priced at \$6.60 (SA) and \$7.70 (VIC/WA) (GST included) per student in attendance. An alternative price for all our shows of \$6.60 (GST included) is available for schools with an Educational Disadvantage Index of 1-3.

A minimum cost of \$1,200 (+GST) is applied to all schools.

Performance Times

While our standard booking times are 10am & 2pm, separate morning times are available for schools who would like to book more than one performance time in the same day.

These times are 9:30am* & 11am.

Safety & Checks

we take the care and safety of our audiences seriously. A total of 5 performers tour with each of our shows, with 2-4 crew members. All cast and crew who tour with The Flying Elephant Company are required to provide current Working With Children Checks, which will be passed on to schools in the lead up to a booking. When making a booking please let us know of any other conditions you would like us to satisfy for company members coming on site. The Flying Elephant Company carries Public Liability Insurance for \$10,000,000.
